


Save the date – Saturday 17th May – Church prayer morning

Cliff College Festival 2025 – Friday 23rd to Monday 26th May

Cliff Festival 2025 runs from *Friday 23rd – Monday 26th May* at Cliff College in Derbyshire (S32 3XG). Expect morning and evening worship, Bible teaching, seminars, games and activities for





people of all ages, opportunities to be reenergised and resourced for mission – and all in the stunning surrounds of the Peak District.

The theme this year is Holiness Calling and the morning bible studies will be led by Dr Ben Pugh who is a lecturer in theology at Cliff College. Other contributors will be announced shortly and closer to the event the programme will be available on the Cliff College website.

They run excellent youth and children's work provision for children aged 2 and upwards. There is the option to visit for the day as well as buying a ticket for the whole weekend (entry is free to all under 18s). Day passes are £25 for adults, £18 for concessions (65 or over/ students/ living with a disability or on benefits). There are additional discounts if you're in the 18-30 age bracket.
