
❖ The Knitted Bible Exhibition in Sheffield - Monday 11th - Saturday 16th August.

Dear Wesley Hall family,

And you do feel like members of our extended family. We received such a warm welcome nearly nine years ago when we first turned up and you have continued that, thankyou. Thankyou for all your prayers and support particularly over the last couple of years of cancer treatment. You have been the most wonderful support in so many ways.

We have had an appointment at Weston Park where they told us that there is no further active cancer treatment available. They are referring me to St Luke's and MacMillan and the emphasis changes from making me ill but hoping to extend my life, to improving the quality of what life I have left.

There is no timescale at the moment as it depends on how slowly or rapidly the tumours develop. They started immediately by giving me a blood transfusion which has improved life already.

I am not afraid and have full trust in the medics as well as a wonderful husband, a supportive huge range of family and friends especially at Wesley Hall. I know that however difficult it gets, God will be looking after us all. Thank you for your support over the last couple of years. We couldn't have got through without you all.

We would be grateful for your continuing prayers, not just for us but for Rachel, Cassie, Matt, Sammy, Tilly and Helen and all the professionals who will be looking after us.
