### ❖ **Circuit Mission Conference**

We are all invited to “Growing Followers of Jesus - Developing Holy Habits” on the morning of Saturday 4th November here at Wesley Hall, from 9:00am to 1:15pm. The keynote speaker is Rev. Andrew Roberts, author of “Holy Habits” (MD Publishing, 2016) and you can also choose one from five available discipleship workshops which consider “Growing followers of Jesus” in different church contexts: Multicultural, New and Fresh Expressions, Traditional Church Communities, the Third Aged, and Younger Generations, X, Y, Z. There will be opening and closing worship, a marketplace to find out about other churches across the Circuit and a bookstall, as well as the opportunity to meet one another and enjoy refreshments.
