ROOF WORKS UPDATE

The roof works are now underway and progress is being made! We would like to keep everyone up to date with what is happening so if you have any questions, please see Matt. The project is scheduled to last until the end of November and a summary of what has happened this week is below:

Structural survey of underside of flat roof has taken place. Some work will be required but this is likely to be within the budget we have set aside for this purpose. A more detailed report will follow.

The cupola has been encased with a plastic tent so lead can be removed without fear of rain water getting in. Photos of the bare wooden dome with the lead removed are below.

Repairs to most sloping roofs are progressing. There is scaffolding all around the building and more slates are being replaced than specified (the new slates are a slightly different colour so can be seen in the picture below). Some of the ridges have also been lifted and rebedded.

All the asphalt has come off the main flat roof and a vapour barrier has been laid. The new insulation will sit on top of this. The lantern fixings are being constructed ready for our new octagon wooden double glazed roof lanterns to be installed later in the job.
