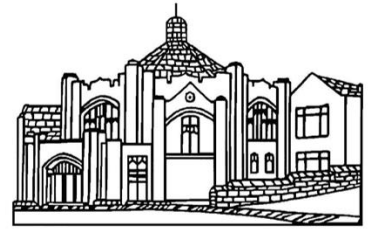

I would encourage you not only to come yourself, but also to invite others from your churches who care about their neighbourhoods and the future of the church's mission. ❖ **Leadership Team & Safeguarding Officer vacancy**

Jo has recently taken the decision to step down from her role on Leadership team and as the church Safeguarding officer. We thank Jo for the time she has devoted to these roles.

Please can you prayerfully consider whether God is asking you to step into either a role on the Leadership team or as the church's safeguarding officer (or both!).

The Leadership team generally meet monthly over Zoom and discusses all areas of church life including pastoral matters, worship, community, property, finance, safeguarding etc. The team currently consists of Michelle, Matt, Jacque, Louise and Emma, and is a way of influencing the future direction of the church.

Safeguarding is a shared responsibility and everyone associated with the Church who comes into contact with children, young people and vulnerable adults has a role to play in this. However, Methodist Church Standing Orders require each church to have a named Church Safeguarding Officer. That person is responsible for ensuring that safeguarding concerns are reported, recorded and acted upon accordingly. The role is less than would be expected in other churches as Matt deals with all the DBS searches and keeps all the records up to date of the safeguarding training that volunteers have attended.

If you wish to put yourself forward to become part of Leadership team or as the church safeguarding officer, or maybe wish to nominate someone, then please have a word with Michelle.

❖ **Food & Community Trust Donation (to support the S6 Foodbank and CAP Debt Advice)**

A couple of weeks ago we were blessed to learn more about the work of the staff and volunteers at the Food & Community trust as well as hear Karen's testimony. We took up a special offering as a way of encouraging the charity and because of your generous donations, we have sent them £240. Many thanks.

❖ **After-School Drop Inn - Volunteers Needed**

For many years the after-school Drop Inn has been running at Wesley Hall, serving hot chocolate and biscuits during the autumn, winter and spring terms, and ice cream during the summer term. The Drop Inn runs on a Tuesday from 2:30pm until 4:30pm during school term time. The youth worker, Jason, runs the Drop Inn with support from volunteers. To be able to run the Drop Inn effectively, a minimum of three people is required for each session. We are now very short of volunteers and are looking for new recruits, either from within Wesley Hall or outside. The volunteering can be flexible in terms of commitments, for example, once or twice a month rather than every Tuesday.
